

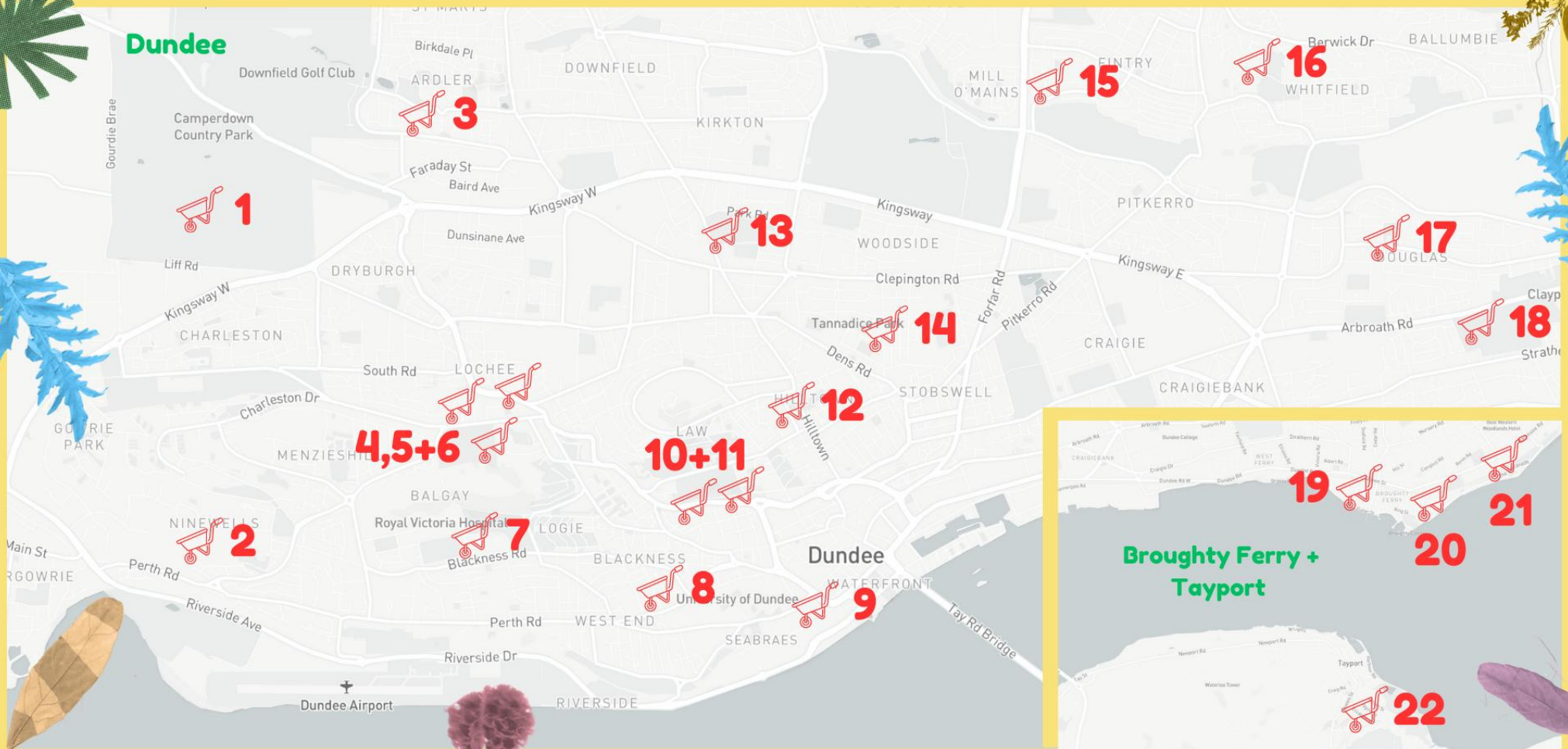
# Dundee Community Gardens Map

## 1 Campy Growers

### Camperdown Country Park DD2 4TF

Welcome to the Vegetarium: Dundee's largest community food garden created by Campy Growers.

The 8 acres land has a community building, a community growing space, many wildlife areas and more. We welcome everyone who wants to give a hand, learn how to grow and tackle food insecurity!

## 2 Ninewells Community Garden

### The Arboretum DD2 1NH

The garden is located in the arboretum in the grounds of Ninewells Hospital and aims to promote physical activity and good health through community gardening; supporting wellbeing, therapy and rehabilitation. The garden includes wheelchair accessible paths, herbaceous borders, vegetable beds, picnic area, garden room and mud kitchen.

## 3 Ardler Community Garden

### Ardler Complex, Turnberry Ave. DD2 3TP

Created in an unloved, concrete courtyard space next to the community complex. Featuring raised beds and a grapevine it now feels like a bountiful walled garden with our signature stripy awning. Fruit is a speciality with raspberries, blackcurrants and endless redcurrants in season.

## 4 Lochee Wee Forest

### Kirk Street DD2 3ES

Nature on your doorstep. Tiny, highly compact native woodland for education, biodiversity and well-being. Take part in citizen science, come to an arts workshop, help us pull out some weeds, or just sit and watch the butterflies. There might even be a few mushrooms lurking about.

## 5 Fruitbowls Community Garden

### 42 Ancrum Road DD2 2HT

Community food growing Garden. A place where you can help grow fruit and veg on the site formerly used as Lochee Park Bowling Green. All welcome. No experience required.



## 6 Lochee Community Gardeners

### Plot 8, Ancrum Road Allotments, DD2

### 2HN and Old Boy's Club corner of Gray's Lane Community Garden DD2 3AP

We grow veggies on the plot and look after a community garden near to Lochee High Street.

## 7 Victoria Gardens

### 301 Blackness Road DD2 2HB

We are a community garden situated in the old bowling green in the west end of Dundee. Our aim is promote environmental awareness and sustainability using as examples, offer people a place to relax, engage with nature, share what we know, learn new skills, spend quality time together and grow. With the support of local groups we are looking of provide quality and healthy food and to engage local people in community action.

## 8 Wee CAIR

### LifeSpace Gallery

### School of Life Sciences DD1 5AA

The University of Dundee is known for its world-leading place in designing and making new medicines. Many of the treatments we use today are descended from molecules made by plants. In our garden, you'll discover both the history of herbalry and future treatments that could save millions of lives.

## 9 Bonnie Dundee IYN

### Dundee City Centre

Bonnie Dundee (IYN) is a group of enthusiastic volunteers who maintain several areas in the city centre. We care for our environment and practice climate friendly gardening e.g. grow flowers from seed, hold litter picks and help spread the word about the importance of biodiversity and pollinating insects.

## 10 Uppertunity Growing Spaces

### The Circle at Dudhope Castle DD36HF

Our garden is based at Dudhope Castle, where we have little pockets of earth friendly greenery, all focused on rewilding and adding biodiversity to our community. Our gardens provide opportunities for people from all backgrounds to gain volunteering experience, learn gardening skills, give back to the environment, learn practical skills and socialise.



## 11 Dundee Therapy Garden

### 16 Dudhope Terrace DD3 6DG

We are a garden for armed forces veterans and ex blue-light service personnel which provides a relaxed atmosphere and beautiful outdoor space in which attendees can improve their physical, psychological and social wellbeing.

## 12 Maxwell Community Garden

### North Wellington Street DD3 7EW

Our garden brings together people of all ages, cultures and backgrounds. We run over 20 sessions weekly to learn, play, create, grow and cook.

We have counted over 350 edible plants grow in our walled garden at the heart of the Hilltown! Everyone is welcome.

## 13 Fairmuir Community Garden

### Fairfield Street DD3 8HU

The garden is the old bowling green in Fairmuir Park now being used by the community to grow flowers and vegetables and hold community events. Everyone is welcome to help out in any way they can or simply sit on a bench and enjoy the garden.

## 14 Foxglove Garden

### Arklay Terrace DD3 7PE

Our garden is south facing in the Maryfield area of Dundee and consists of a number raised beds, orchard, pond, polytunnel, x2 sheds and soft fruit border.



## 15 Fintry Community Garden

### Finavon Terrace DD4 9ED

We believe that Fintry needs a green space, where people from all walks of life can come and enjoy a shared garden. That may be just for a walk through the garden, to come and relax or to come and volunteer to help out.

## 16 Roundhouse Garden

### Lothian Crescent, Dundee, DD4 0HU

Our garden produces food that is used in our food project and cafe - to provide nourishing meals to people that need them. Plus the garden is a lovely outside space for those who use the Roundhouse.

## 17 Douglas Community Park

### Balmoral Avenue Dundee DD4 8SD

Douglas Community Park is a public green space with accessible play equipment, managed by a group of local Trustees through Douglas Community Spaces Group. Working in collaboration with Douglas Fruit & Vegetable Growers' Association

## 18 Duntrune Community Garden

### Dawson Park, Caenlochan Road DD5 1JX

The garden is run by SAMH (Scottish Association of Mental Health) and a large group of volunteers. We have self referral to a horticultural therapy programme or you can drop in to garden with us or just to explore the garden and plant sale area.

## 19 Queen St Community Garden

### Queen St Broughty Ferry DD5 2TB

Local groups working with young people maintain various raised beds. Also planting for biodiversity to encourage wildlife into an urban area.

## 20 Shiell St Community Garden

### Shiell St Broughty Ferry DD5 2DG

A small oasis for wildlife by a busy footpath to the waterfront in the East of Broughty Ferry. The raised beds are maintained by Grove Academy and Great Beginnings Nursery.

## 21 Barnhill Garden

### Esplanade, Broughty Ferry DD5 2EP

The garden is approximately 5 acres between Bridge Street and Shiell Street.

There are trees and shrubs and several habitats including: Scree beds with natural rock, a heather bed, fernery, 'Snowdrop Wood', primula border and a glasshouse which is the information centre and meeting point.

## 22 PLANT Community Garden

### Pond Lane, Tayport DD6

PLANT runs a Community Garden that local volunteers manage and maintain. We garden organically, with respect for biodiversity, promoting climate-friendly gardens to the Tayport community. We provide locally-grown vegetables and promote a love of wildlife, growing things and the outdoors to our children.
